

## GENERAL INFO

We accept the following recyclables at the Site w/ Pitt Lake Collection Site Sticker in Window.

**Appliances** – all appliances are \$5 except freon, which are \$15 *\*If you have an energy account with Xcel, they will pick up your old, working refrigerator for free and you will receive \$35.*

**Automotive** – anti-freeze, batteries, motor oil and oil filters for free

**Household** – clothing, shoes, towels, bedding and small rugs can be placed in the ReUse Bins **AFTER** June 2021 at the collection sites.

**Fibers BIN** – dry food boxes, corrugated containers, Newspaper, magazines, food cartons, (milk, juice, soy, soup). No Freezer Cardboard or pizza boxes (except for top lid that is unsoiled). All fibers must be clean and dry.

**Glass/Plastic/Metal BIN** – aluminum and bi-metal (steel + aluminum) cans. Aluminum/bi-metal cans and metal bottle caps are to be recycled with plastics, not with scrap metal. Glass bottles and jars (containers like Pyrex and drinking glasses are not recyclable). Plastics #1, #2 and #5 containers and lids. NO PLASTIC BAGS

**Medication** – All medications can be taken to the Dunn County Sheriff's Department at 615 Stokke Parkway, Menomonie, WI 54751, not at Pitt Lake site

**Electronics** – All electronics can be taken to Recyc-All Services, LLC in Menomonie, WI 715-590-2838. Many for Free. Pitt Lake will accept for a large FEE

**Yard Waste:** Pitt Lake will not accept any yard waste

**Smoke Detectors:** See Attendant

## Pitt Lake will be doing hazardous waste events and electronic events in 2022.

**Batteries to be recycled** – Automotive, alkaline manganese (rechargeable), lithium/lithium ion, nickel-cadmium and sealed lead acid for **free** with pass. Ask site attendant where the batteries should be disposed.

### Batteries for Trash

-Button, alkaline (manganese), carbon zinc, zinc-air, silver oxide, and mercury oxide.

=Wisconsin has no legal requirements for disposing of household dry-cell batteries which include AAA, AA, A, B, C, D and 9-volt

-**NOTE:** Several department stores will take back used batteries at their photo department. Ask if yours does.

-All non-recyclables (trash) can be brought to the Pitt Lake site and disposed of for free with Pitt Lake Collection Site Pass

### RECYCLING GUIDELINES

**Cardboard** – clean, free of debris and flattened.

**Cans** – rinsed clean of product residue, well-drained, and recycled with plastics (not scrap metal). Please remove food!

**Glass** – only bottles and jars are recyclable. Rinse containers before recycling.

**Plastics** - #1, #2 and #5 containers and lids should be rinsed clean of product residue, well-drained and flattened. Place caps back on containers after flattening. We **DO NOT** recycle **plastic bags**, flowerpots, pail/buckets/barrels, coolers, etc. Please consider shopping with re-usable canvas and re-purposing plastic items we currently don't recycle. Most stores have bins to return plastic bags to after purchase.

**Paper** – clean and free of non-paper items.

**Construction/Demo Waste:** Most construction and demolition waste are accepted for disposal for \$40/cubic yard. Shingles, cinder blocks, concrete, lumber and/or drywall are \$80/cubic yard.

**Appliances:** Refrigerators\*, freezers, dehumidifiers, heat pumps, central and window air conditioners can be disposed of for \$15  
\*If you have an energy account with Xcel, they will pick up your old working refrigerator for free and you will receive \$35. All Non Freon appliances will be \$5

## MATERIALS BANNED FROM WISCONSIN LANDFILLS

### Banned from disposal since 1991

- Lead acid batteries (automotive). Waste Oil
- Major appliances (air conditioners, clothes washers and dryers, dishwashers, refrigerators, freezers, stoves, ovens, microwave ovens, dehumidifiers, furnaces, boilers or water heaters)

### Banned from disposal since 1993

- Yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves, yard and garden debris, and brush under four inches in diameter

### Banned from disposal since 1995

- Aluminum containers
- Corrugated paper or other containerboard
- Plastic contains #1 (PETE) and #2 (DHPE).
- Glass containers
- Magazines and other materials printed on similar paper.
- Newspapers and other materials printed on newsprint
- Office paper
- Steel containers
- Containers made from a combination of steel and aluminum (bi-metal cans).
- Waste tires

### Banned from disposal since 2010

- Computers
- Desktop printers and printer/fax/copier/scanner combinations.
- Video display devices, including televisions, laptop computers and computer monitors.
- Oil filters and oil absorbents

## ORDINANCE

Failing to properly dispose of waste is in violation of ORD 2020-02 of the Town of Dunn ordinance for the Pitt Lake Collection Site and may result in fines.
